This was a short inspection in order to confirm that the school continues to be 'good' and that safeguarding is effective. This was confirmed by the HMI and as such, grades from our previous inspection remain unchanged.

We are delighted that Ofsted have recognised the continued success of the school and the very good progress that has been made since the last inspection.
