Progress

Reading

100% of eligible PP pupils made two levels progress in reading compared to 96% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

100% of eligible PP pupils made three levels progress in reading compared to 45% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

Writing

100% of eligible PP pupils made two levels progress in writing compared to 97% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

67% of eligible PP pupils made three levels progress in writing compare to 39% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

Mathematics

100% of eligible PP pupils made two levels progress in maths compared to 83% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

100% of eligible PP pupils made three levels progress in maths compared to 38% of non-eligible pupils nationally.

PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT 2015 - 2016

The purpose of the Pupil Premium Grant is to narrow the attainment gaps between those children eligible for the funding and their peers. Governors ensure that Pupil Premium funding is being spent on improving attainment and progress for eligible pupils.

The Pupil Premium Grant is a separate funding stream to be used solely for the educational benefit of children eligible and registered for free school meals (FSM) at any time during the last six years, or looked after children from the first day of care, or those adopted from care or leaving care under a special guardianship order or residency order.

The amount of funding per pupil for 2015/16 is:

- £1 320 for pupils eligible for FSM in the last six years
- £1 900 for looked after pupils or for pupils who have left care
