Our Learning

To begin the year we are going back in time to the earliest recorded humans, and learning about what life was like in the Stone Age. Over the course of the half term we will jump forwards thousands of years to look at the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. We will use a range of story books linked to this topic to excite the children and spark their imaginations in English lessons.

We will be developing our use of conjunctions to extend our ideas. We will also look at using adjectives to add detail to our story writing.

In maths, we will be focusing on place value, addition, subtraction and word problems. To challenge children we will ask them to: •Verbally explain mathematical thinking in their own words

•Draw a picture or diagram to communicate what they have done

•Continue to explore without prompting

Our artwork will focus on buildings, and we will use the work of Paul Klee to inspire the children. We will replicate his style to create art that represents famous Warrington landmarks. Keep looking at our class pages to see the children at work, and see their finished pieces.

Our RE topic focuses on rules and when and why they are important. We will write class rules and think about the impact that they will have on our learning. We will also look at our Christian Values and discuss if they are rules or not. We will link sets of rules that we follow each day to our Christian Values.

PE

This half term, our focus is agility and teamwork. The children will develop these skills through learning how to play softball and in multiskills lessons.

In multiskills, children will develop agility, balance and coordination through a number of games including football.

In softball, the children will develop batting, catching and bowling skills.. We will end the half term with a competition were children will be put into small teams and compete against the other Year 3 classes.

Science: Rocks & Soils

This is one of our favourite science topics. The children will have the opportunity to develop many

investigative skills, exploring which type of soil drains best, observing the features of a range of different rocks, and thinking about which type of rock would make the best spear head.

We will also learn how soil is made, and think about why it is so important.
