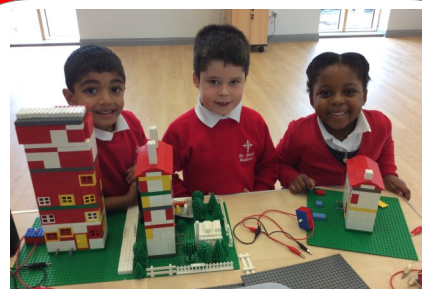

We would like to assure parents that this behaviour will not be tolerated and that measures are being taken to stop this. Please report any further incidents to the school. Thank you for your support.

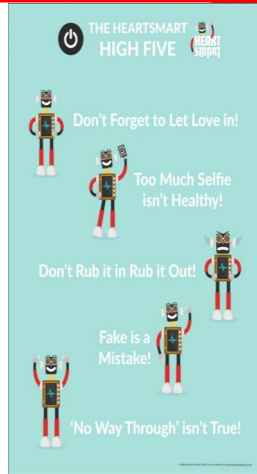
## Reception Children 2018

£8 per HALF day - flexible to individual requirements but no more than 4 hours.

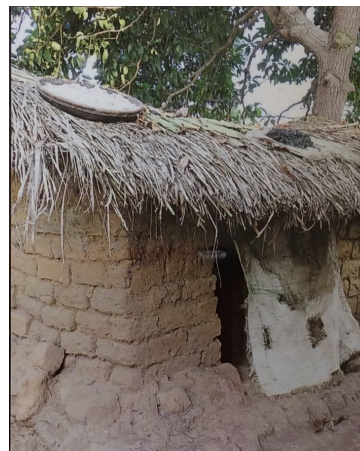
