E-Safety Information

NSPCC figures show most parents unaware of social media requirements Research published by the NSPCC has found the majority of parents have no knowledge of social media user criteria.

An online survey carried out on behalf of the charity by ResearchBods questioned 2,608 parents, half of which did not know about the age minimums people should be before they are active on websites and apps such as Kik, Snapchat and ooVoo. Statistics also showed one in five parents thought there were no age requirements at all.

Through their e-safety partnership, Net Aware, the NSPCC and telecommunications giant

O2 have developed an online tool parents can use to learn more about websites, games and apps popular with young people.

Parents who wish to improve their skills and confidence to talk to their children about staying safe on the web may also wish to access Share Aware, another NSPCC programme.
