Happy New Year! We hope you all had a peaceful and relaxing Christmas break. Thank you very much for your kind wishes, cards and generous gifts. The staff and children have been extremely eager to share their Christmas news with each other and we are all excited for the challenges of the term ahead.

Language

This week we have enjoyed sharing the story 'Supertato'. The children entered the classroom to discover a collection of fruits and vegetables had been trapped and tied up by a cheeky pea. We followed the clues that had been left to help us find Supertato and then decided to set a trap to catch the pea. The trap worked and we celebrated by writing speech bubbles for the story characters. We thought about what they might say throughout the story and recorded our ideas in sentences with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

Maths

We are introducing the children to number doubles. The children have impressed us with their ability to make doubles using their fingers and they are now beginning to calculate the totals of the doubles by counting all of their fingers. To support the children in this skill, they have been doubling the spots on superhero masks. Our aim is to help the children learn these double facts so that they can recall them quickly and without counting.

Spellings

All children completed a spelling assessment before Christmas. Please continue to support the children in practising these words as we will re-assess them before the end of this half term. If your child was able to correctly spell all of the words, why not challenge them to write them correctly within the context of a sentence?

This week's homework task will run for two weeks. We would like the children to make a mask for a superhero of their own design.
