

SIAMS INSPECTION

A Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) took place yesterday.

Our assigned inspector, Ann Lock, was tasked with grading the school on the following question:

How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?

Ann spent the whole day with us exploring this question through seven strands. A huge thank you to all the pupils, staff, governors and parents who met and worked with the inspector.

We had a very positive day and we eagerly await the inspector's report which will be shared with parents when it arrives.

READING

Did you know that...

- reading with your child for just 21 minutes a day exposes them to 2 million words over time?
- talking together as a family is a vital part of vocabulary development?
- children need to hear a word many times before they will use it themselves?
- a more extended vocabulary increases your child's chances later in life?

The vocabulary gap can begin with children as young as three years of age, so it is important that children become 'word rich' as young as possible.

Please support your child's reading to enable them to extend their vocabulary and apply this across the curriculum.
