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# Reception Newsletter - 29th March 2019

## Language

Last week we read the story of 'Tom and the Island of Dinosaurs' by Ian Beck. The children loved the story and were excited to think of ways that they could rescue the dinosaurs from the smoking volcano. We have been assessing their independent writing skills as they have written letters to the girl on the island, described the journey to the island and even designed and explained their own maps of the island. The children were very keen to write and it has been lovely to see so many of our taught spellings coming through in the context of their sentences. We are now working hard on ensuring we always remember our finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. This week we have been researching facts about dinosaurs and fossils using the non-fiction text, 'Digging up Dinosaurs'. We managed to answer some of the questions from our initial mind map and have been writing about our findings using all of our writing targets. We were particularly surprised to find out that dinosaurs used to be called 'terrible lizards'!

## Maths

Last week we practised our mental maths skills to help us solve number problems more quickly. We explored the ways that we can find half of an amount, as well as investigating the different ways we make 5 by adding two numbers together. This week we have been practising our counting skills in order to ensure that we are all counting accurately, forwards and backwards to and from 20. Please continue to support children learning and ordering numbers to 20 and writing these independently.

## **Spellings**

Next week we will continue our assessments of the children's spellings. Our focus words for this half term are: not, up, put, had, big, he, she, we, me, be

We will also be re-assessing children on any words they were unable to spell in our previous assessment. Please continue to practise these at home.
