Our Charity Group led our worship on Monday and included a quiz about Leprosy. Did you know that

every 2 minutes someone is diagnosed with leprosy and that this is common in poorer countries?

Did you know that it only costs £24 to find and cure one person with leprosy and £320 for life changing surgery?

During Lent we often give things up when we should really be thinking about what we can give back. Children have already started bringing in small coins for our collection that will go to the Heal Nepal appeal. Whatever we give will be doubled, if we raise £24 then £48 will heal two people of leprosy.

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
