Literacy

Last Monday we had a fantastic day at Manchester Airport. The children were wonderful and enjoyed participating in lots of fun activities. Back at school, the children completed some wonderful independent writing to describe our trip. They remembered lots of important writing tricks including capital letters, full stops and finger spaces and we were particularly impressed by their ability to spell lots of high frequency words. This week our literacy work has taken a phonics focus as we have been revisiting some of the sounds we have been finding tricky in our reading books ('oa' as in 'coat, 'ar' as in 'card, 'or' as in 'port', 'air' as in 'hair', 'ear' as in 'hear').

Maths

Our math's work last week involved lots of measuring. We used balances, tape measures, measuring jugs, clocks and stopwatches to solve a range of measuring problems, ensuring the children were using the correct vocabulary to describe their findings (e.g. heavier, lighter etc). This week the children have been working hard to demonstrate their independent application of number skills. We have been ordering numbers to 20, finding one more and one less and solving lots of addition and subtraction problems by counting on and back. Common difficulties have included doubling numbers larger than 5 and finding half of an amount. Please continue to practise these skills at home.

Spellings

This week children have been re-assessed on words they spelt incorrectly in previous assessments, as well as their most recent set of spellings. Scores have now been sent home. Please continue to practise these words at home as we will be revisiting these words next half term. We will also be practising our new spellings. These spellings are:

they, all, are, my, let, will, this, then, that, went
