Reception Newsletter - 5th July 2019

Language

Last week we shared the traditional tale of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' with the children. We discussed the repetitive language in the text and enjoyed retelling the story using our character voices and lots of expression. The children wrote about the character of the giant and also began to write their own retellings of the story, ensuring their high frequency words were spelt correctly. This week we have been writing instructions for making bird feeders. We tried very hard to include our capital letters, finger spaces and full stops and we thoroughly enjoyed following the instructions to see how clear they were. We have made some excellent bird feeders for our outside classroom.

Maths

Our maths work last week involved solving a variety of measuring problems linked to Jack and the Beanstalk; we measured lengths of beanstalks using our hands, we compared capacities of bowls for the giant's breakfast, we investigated weights of items for Jack to carry down the beanstalk and we used the stopwatch to time how long it would take us to climb the beanstalk (on the climbing frame in the outside classroom). This week we have been practising doubling numbers and we are using this knowledge to help us find half of a number.

Spellings

Our final spellings for this half term are listed below. We will be assessing the children on their ability to spell these words in the next couple of weeks and we will then send home their scores. We are also continuing to assess spellings from tests that have taken place throughout the year. Our current spellings are:

they, all, are, my, let, will, this, them, that, went

Please continue to practise these at home.
