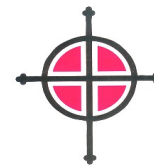

£15 per FULL day - 8.30am to 5.00pm

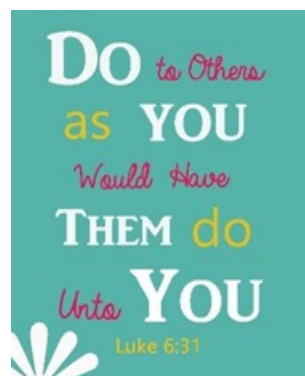
£8 per HALF day - flexible to individual requirements but no more than 4 hours.

Y1 Chester Zoo Trip

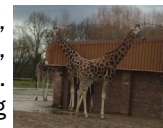
On Friday 17th January, Year 1 set off on their adventure to Chester Zoo. They were all very excited.
