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# Reception Newsletter - Friday 14th February 2020

### Language

Following our visit from the fire brigade last week, we used non-fiction books to help us learn more about the emergency services. We introduced the children to the vocabulary associated with these texts, including 'contents page', 'index' and 'glossary' and the children used the books to help them locate information and record simple facts. This week we have been using our writing skills to help us describe our wonderful superhero masks. We are particularly focusing on our use of capital letters and our ability to record our Phase 3 sounds in our spellings (a list of these sounds can be found on the Reception homepage).

#### Maths

Over the last couple of weeks we have been practising our measuring skills. We have been using the vocabulary associated with time and capacity to help us solve problems for superheroes. We thought of ways we could compare containers to find out which would give Superman the biggest drink, as well as using stop watches to time ourselves completing simple tasks. The children have really impressed us with their enthusiasm and problem solving ideas!

After half term we will be learning about money and children will be handling coins and making simple amounts.

#### **Spellings**

We have now completed our next stage of spelling assessments. Children have brought home their scores for our recent spelling test, as well as a retest of the words we learnt before Christmas. Please continue to practise these at home. Our new spellings for after half term will be:
