On Friday, the Year 6 children were treated to a visit from some scientists from Manchester University who delivered magnificent physics and biology workshops. They learnt about fundamental forces, made motors, and extracted strawberry DNA.

To end our week, Dr Emily Grossman, from the TV show, 'Duck Echoes Don't Quack' visited us to share her book. The children were captivated by her assembly which saw her trap a tickle and make a cloud. Lots of the children bought her book, 'Brain Fizzing Facts' which she signed for them.
