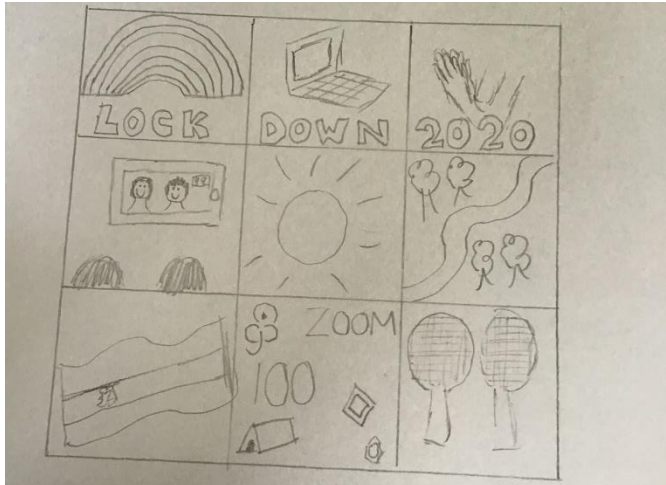


Creating a Prototype for Your Memory Quilt

1. Get your design out from last week.



2. If you haven't done yet, think about what colours you would like on your quilt.
3. Get paper, it doesn't have to be coloured as you can colour it in yourself, and cut it into as many squares as you need.
4. Then, think about if you are going to layer more paper on it or draw the design onto it. If you are going to use more paper, this will be material when you come to make it.
5. Create your design on each square and then join them together using glue or cellotape.
6. If you look at Miss Stewart's example she has used paper to layer over each other and then used pen and paper to add extra detail. She has also changed her design from her original sketch - that's okay! She decided that the main theme of that square was that she has been doing virtual Brownie meetings, so she made that the focus and then added a couple of badges and a tent to represent sleeping outside as part of a virtual sleepover. She could add even more detail with pencil on the badges if she wanted or just leave it as an outline.
