


What is forgiveness?

What is forgiveness?

This man is called Martin Luther King Junior. He was a Christian who campaigned for the human rights of black people in the USA in the last century (1950s and 60s).



What does he mean when he said, "Forgiveness is not an occasional act, it is a constant attitude"?

Motthew 18:21-22
