<u>Language</u>

We loved reading about how much you enjoyed our 'Jack and the Beanstalk' work from last week and we have seen some fantastic bird feeders being made this week! It is clear to see that children are continuing to work hard on their application of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. When children are set a writing task, please encourage them to use their phonics skills and record their ideas as independently as they can. This way, we are able to see what they can do well and which areas we need to support them in further.

Maths

The children have been working very hard on their calculation skills when counting on and back! This week we are working on our number facts. The tasks that are being set are designed to support children in their calulating by helping them to learn about relationships between numbers and to provide support for counting in different ways. Please encourage children to continue to practise their counting everyday (forwards and backwards from different starting points).

Spellings

Our focus spellings for this half term are:

look, day, him, his, but, can, back, of, if, off

Please also continue to practise previous spellings so that they are not forgotten.
