

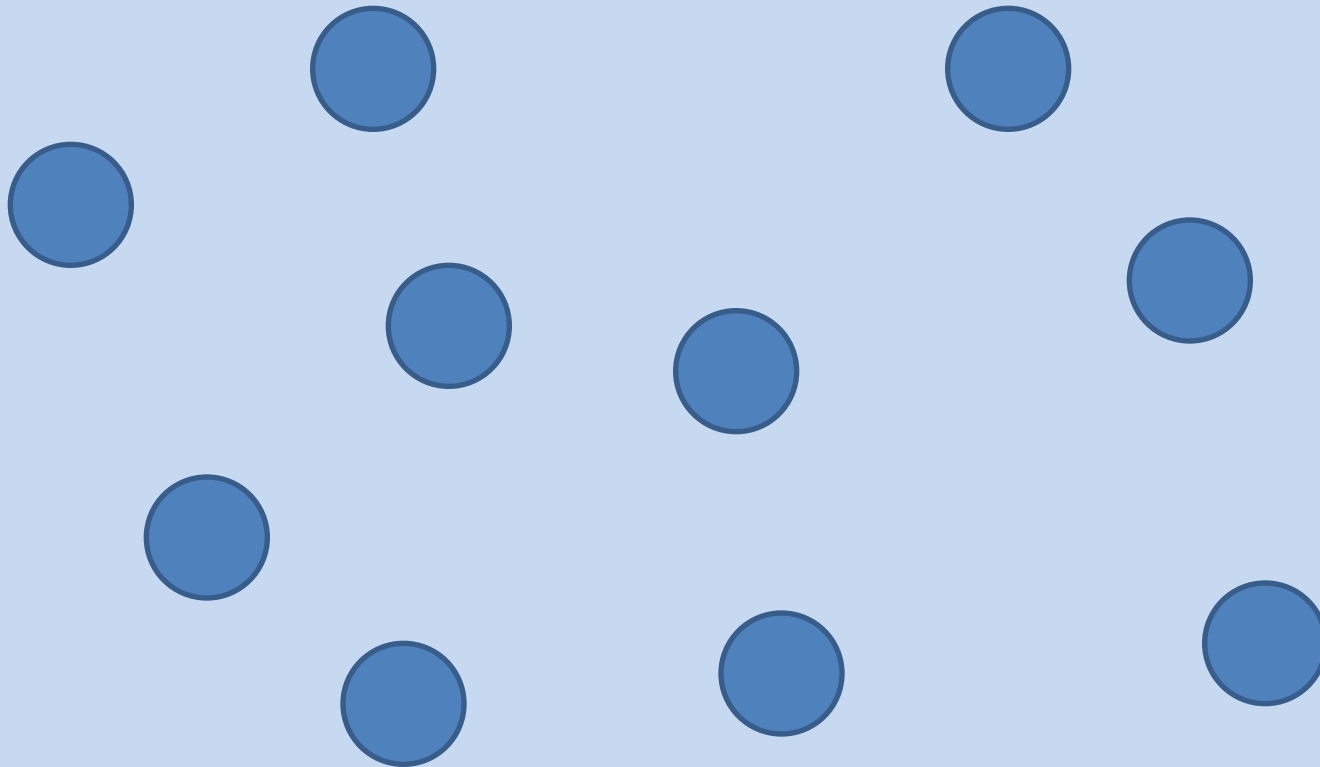
LO: To use 's' and 'es' for plural words.

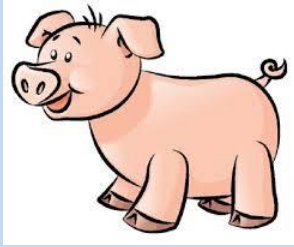
Success criteria:

- Add the suffix 's' or es' to the noun.

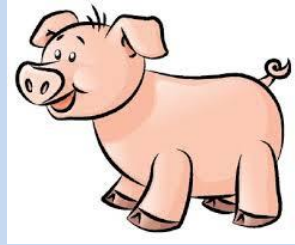
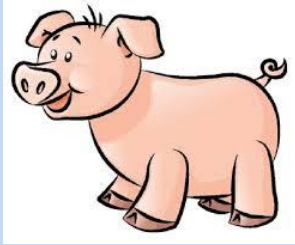
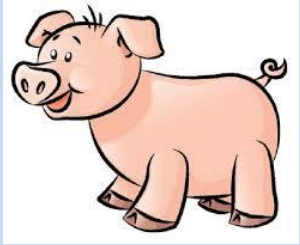
What does plural mean?

A plural is more of something.

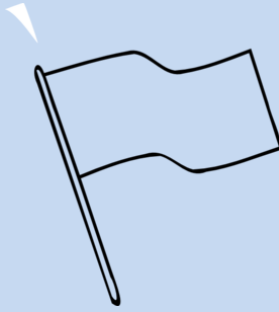




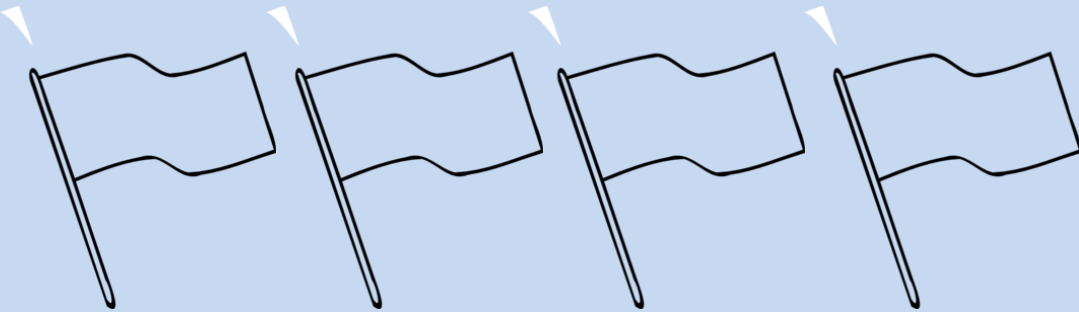
I can see a pig.



I can see some pigs.



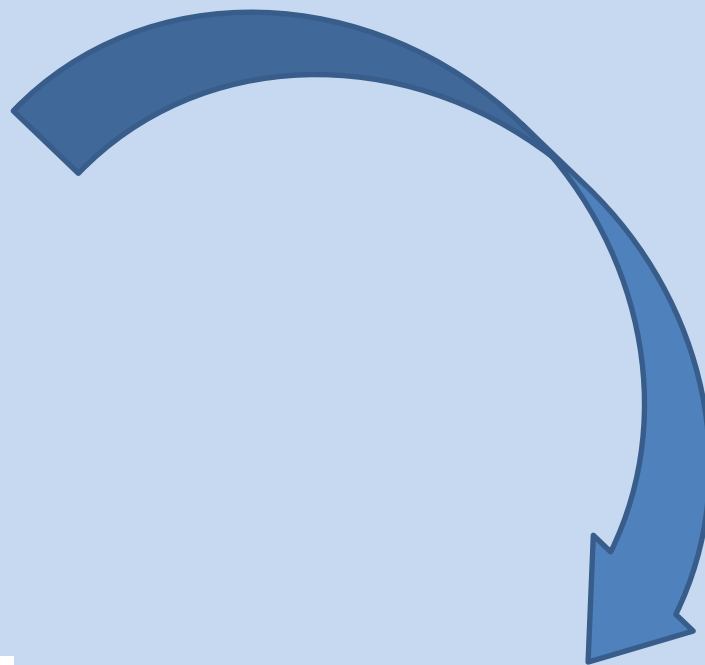
I can see a **flag**.
