All Around the World

We have been delighted by the children's responses to our new and final project in Reception. They have shown enthusiasm and excitement when learning about new countries around the world and we have loved looking at all of their wonderful work! Our project will culminate in a week of learning linked to the Olympics. We will learn about how the Olympics began and the sports that are involved. This is in preparation for the exciting event which has been postponed until next year, so that the children will have some knowledge of the competing countries, as well as the competition itself.

Language

Last week our learning took us to the beautiful country of India, where we learnt about the Hindu God Ganesha and his passion for sweet treats. The children wrote descriptions of Ganesha, as well as constructing descriptions of their own favourite desserts. It is lovely to see so many children remembering to apply their writing targets to their sentences! This week, we have been learning about the USA. The children have been extremely enthusiastic in their work and we have been impressed by their thoughtful and creative writing, particularly about the Disney parks. We have also loved looking at their very imaginative rollercoaster designs! Remember to keep using sound mats to support children in their independent spelling of words.

Maths

We have been using the Oak National Academy online lessons to support the children in their learning of number facts. Last week children worked hard to recall their doubling and halving knowledge. It is important that children practise these skills so that they can apply them to their calculating. This week we are continuing to practise our addition skills by combining quantities and counting on to solve a problem.

Spellings

We will be practising these spellings throughout the half term, before setting an assessment task for children at the end of term. Our new spellings are:
