

Fireworks Painting Activity

Supplies

- Dark coloured card or paper
- Scissors
- Cardboard tube (kitchen or toilet roll is fine)
- Poster paints
- Paper plates
- Glitter




1 Cut strips into the bottom of the cardboard tube, making the cuts longer for bigger fireworks, or shorter for smaller fireworks. Try to cut them evenly as this makes it easier to dip in the paint.



5 Pick another colour for the final layer. It is best to choose a contrasting colour to help the fireworks “pop”. This layer won’t need as much coverage as the previous two.




2 Pour a small amount of paint onto a paper plate, enough to cover the bottom. You will want to use a separate plate and tube for each colour.



6 Repeat to make a scene of fireworks.



3 Dip the tube into the paint, and dab onto the card. Rotate the tube whilst continuously dabbing.



7 Before the paint dries, sprinkle glitter over the wet paint to make them sparkle.



4 Use a different colour to do the same on top of the first layer.
