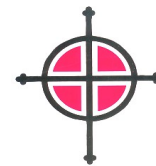

Positive Covid Test Results

If your child tests positive for Covid-19 please can you inform school, even if they are already isolating due to another family member having symptoms or testing positive. This is because we have to report any positive cases to the Department for Education and Public Health and to establish if they have had contact with anybody in school whilst infectious.



Drop off and Pick Up times

While you are queuing at the front of the school premises to drop off/pick up your child please ensure that you are following the government guidelines regarding the current lockdown and social distancing procedures.

Please make sure that your child is with you at all times and is not running along the queue, across the car park or the front of the building and they are not interacting with children/adults from other households.

When children are mixing with others from different households it negates the work that we are doing in school to keep classes separate. We are doing our very best to keep everyone safe and to keep all classes open.

Covid-19 (coronavirus) - Clarification of isolation periods

How long does self-isolation last?

- If a child or family member is a confirmed case they must not leave home for **10** days from the onset of symptoms or the date of test if they have no symptoms. The day of onset of symptoms/date of test is considered day 0. For example if a person develops symptoms on 1st November then day 0 is 1st November and 11th November is day 10. Child/family member can return to school/work on day 11 i.e. 12th November.
- If a child or family member has been identified as a close contact of a confirmed case they must not leave home for **14** days from the date they last had contact with the case. The date they last had contact with the case is considered day 0. For example if a child last had contact with the case on 1st November then day 0 is 1st November and 15th November is day 14. Child/staff member can return to school on day 15 i.e. 16th November.

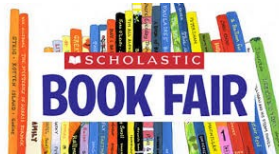

The theme for Anti-Bullying Week this year is 'United Against Bullying'.

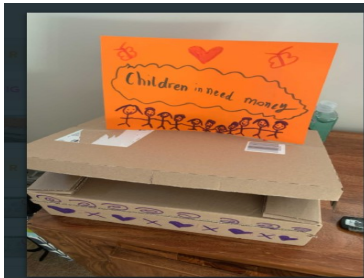
