It is also important that children are continuing to access learning tasks when at home and are sharing their work with the teachers using their Purple Mash accounts. Although we are working hard to ensure there are plenty of learning opportunities for children to explore whilst they are at home, please be reassured that there is no requirement for children to participate in every live session, nor each set task. Similarly, follow up tasks and additional activities do not need to be completed within the timetabled slots. Evenings and weekends can be used to catch up on anything that you particularly want the children to do. We understand that too much screen time is not good for our children. We also appreciate that many of you will be trying to work from home yourselves, or support older or younger siblings.

We have experienced some technical issues in school this week due to the increased amount of time we are all needing to spend online. Similarly, we understand that a number of families have been experiencing similar difficulties. Please ensure that any problems are reported to the school office, rather than as an announcement or a comment during our live lessons. Teachers are unable to respond to these issues whilst they are streaming. If you are experiencing a problem that is preventing you from joining the live stream then please don't worry. There are a number of additional activities that the children can participate in on our 'School Work for Remote Learning' tab on the website. Similarly, children can always access the Reading Eggs app or explore activities on Purple Mash, or even continue with their physical exercise.

Once again, thank you for your patience. Despite the problems we have been faced with this week, our children have been wonderful and they have, yet again, made us extremely proud.
