How we are adapting our lessons





In RE this week reception classes have been learning about the story of Joseph. The children at home have enjoyed recreating

the technicolour coat Joseph was given and we have all discussed if this was a fair gift?





Year 1 classes are adapting their PE lessons so that those children at home are able to join in too.





Year 3 has been focussing on science skills and setting challenges for the children at home and in class.

Last Friday's challenge was to find out why chocolate melted so quickly when it was in your hand, and if there was somewhere else that it would melt even faster, even between your toes.

It was a messy, but very tasty afternoon, and it was lovely to see the children at home learning and having fun alongside their friends in school.



Year 6 are concentrating on the scientific skill 'observing over time' and we have linked this to previous learning about microorganisms. The children at home have set up an investigation to find out how quickly mould grows on bread which has been subjected to different conditions. The children are updating their observations daily.





Year 6 have also taken part in the BBC's live lesson: The Big Schools Winter Watch. We are looking forward to recording the types of birds we see in our gardens over the weekend and submitting this to the RSPB website.
