
We can sort animals into 3 groups based on what they eat.














These are animals like chickens that can eat seeds and worms.




Can you sort the animals into herbivore, omnivore or carnivore?


Your task: Read the animal cards to find out what the animals eat. Then sort them into the venn diagram, deciding whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.



A sheep eats grass.




It is a carnivore.

A cat eats mice.




It is a carnivore.
