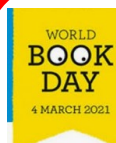

World Book Day



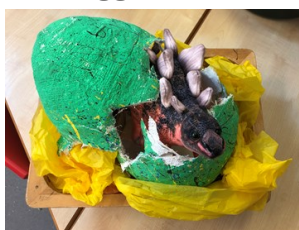
