Language

Our literacy work this week has centred around the mystery of the egg and the baby dinosaur. We wrote lists of the things we thought we might need to look after a baby dinosaur. We even made predictions about the different types of dinosaur that could be in the egg and wrote simple sentences to describe them. Next week our learning will take more of a non-fiction focus as we will be learning about the characteristics of different dinosaurs and we will begin to compose questions about things we want to know, to help guide our learning through the project.

Maths

This week we have been developing our knowledge and understanding related to money. We learnt about the different coins we use and started to make some simple amounts with them. We also practised counting in 2s to help us when combining 2ps. Next week we will be revisiting our counting on and counting back skills and thinking about our favourite methods for adding or subtracting.
