Alice landed with a bump and found herself in a room surrounded by doors. She tried every single one, but they were all locked.

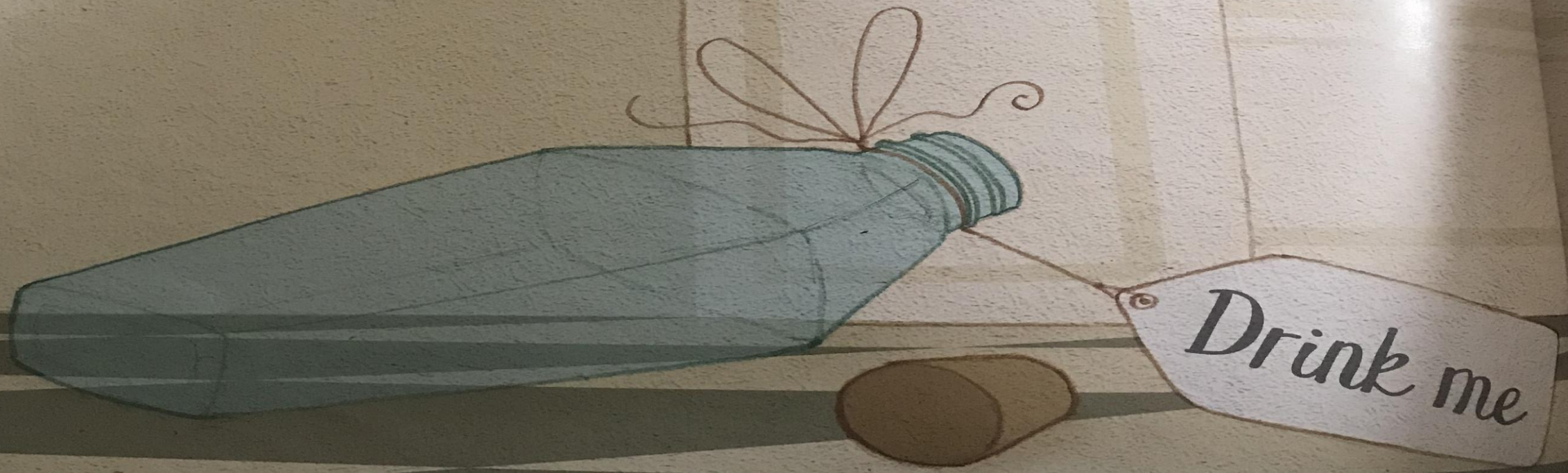
Then she spotted a table with a tiny key on top ... and it fitted the tiniest door. But Alice could only peep through at the beautiful garden on the other side.

she exclaimed.




Next, Alice noticed a bottle with the words *'Drink me'* on it. She took a small sip ... and shrank to a teeny-tiny size!

she started to shrink again.




Now Alice was REALLY confused.

which floated in the air.

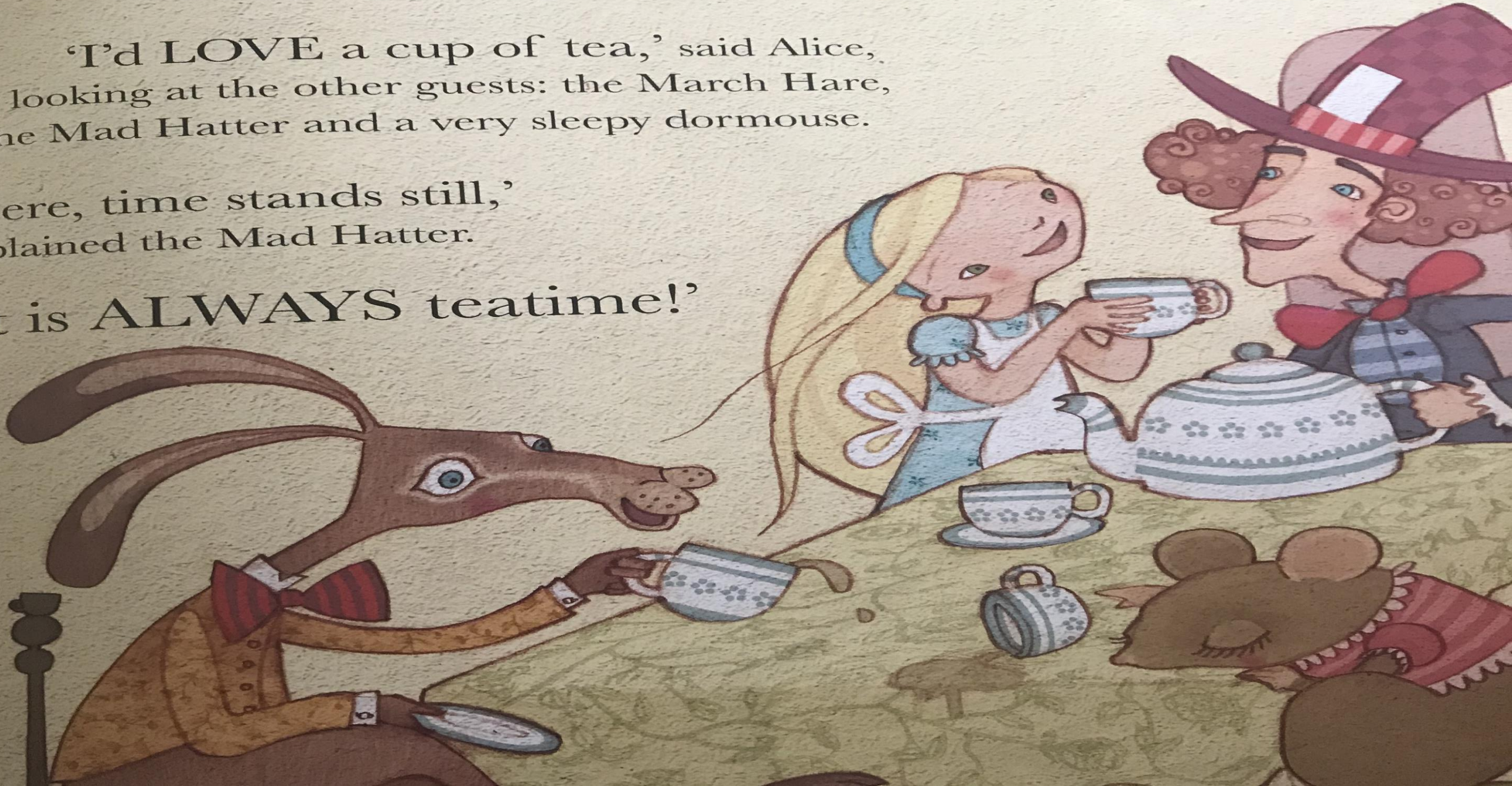


So Alice went to the March Hare's house,

'Here! You! Come and play croquet with us!'



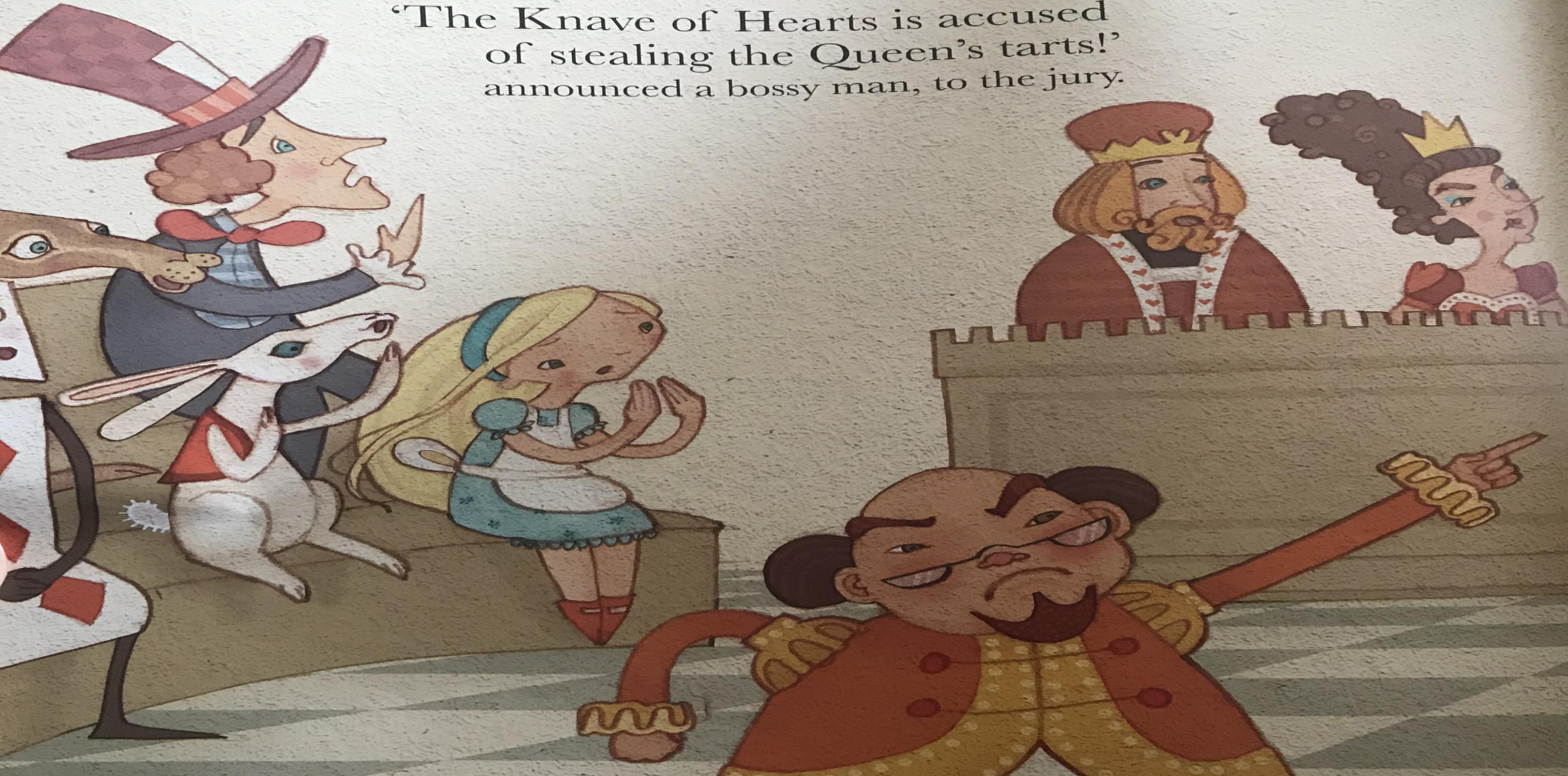
So Alice joined in the strangest game ever.

'The trial is beginning!'



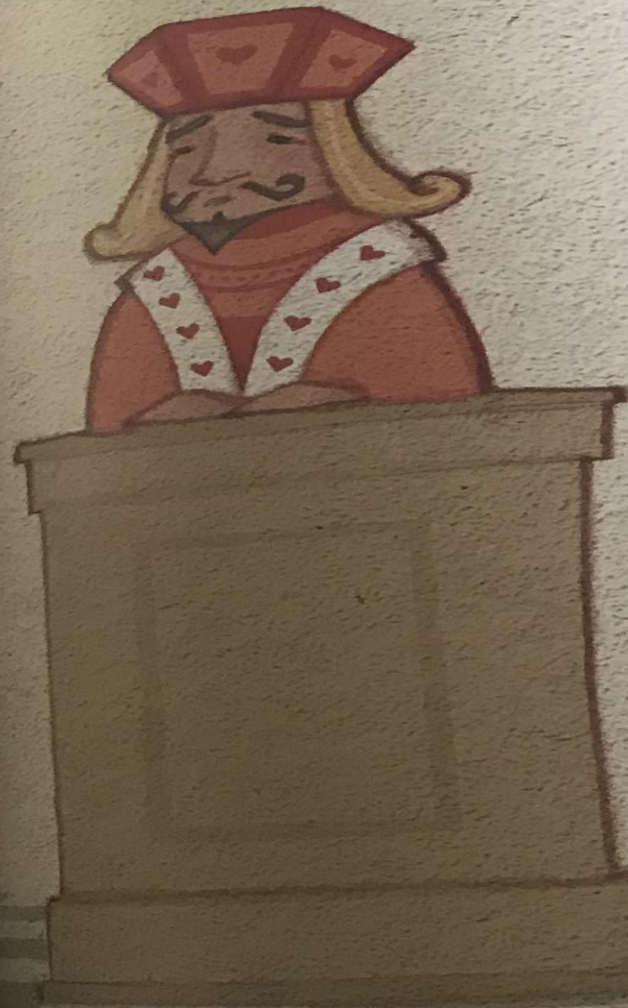
Everyone dashed to the courtroom,
