# Suffixes

# What is a verb?



A verb is a word that tells you what somebody or something is doing or feeling. *Play*, *jump* and *work* are all verbs.

# What is a suffix?

When suffixes are added to verbs, they tell you when something happened. The suffix -ed tells you that it happened in the past.



A suffix is a group of letters, or just one letter that can be added to the end of words to change their meaning.

Read the words below and see if you can hear a difference in the way you say the endings.

played

hunted

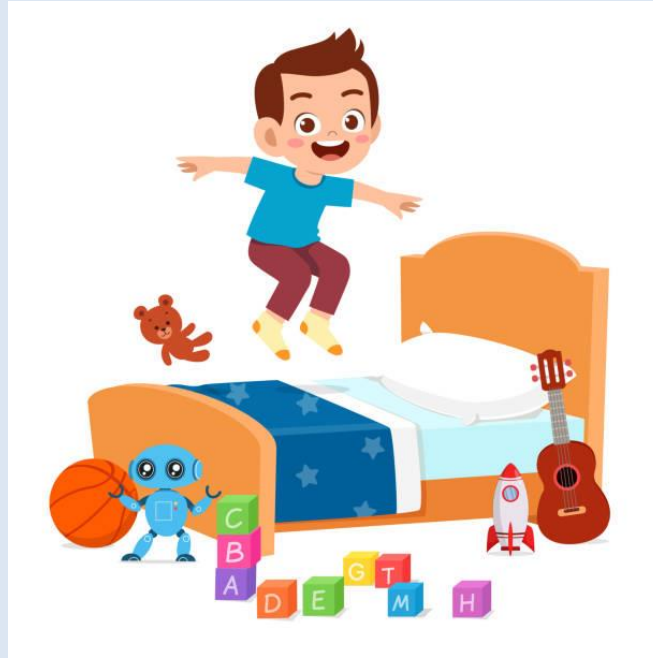
