In Reception, our World Book Day focus has been the 'Gigantosaurus' series of books by Jonny Duddle. We have enjoyed sharing stories in funny places, writing book reviews and sharing our wonderful outfits with our friends!





Y5 pupils came into school dressed as their favourite book characters. It was lovely to see how they have been inspired by a range of our class novels, including the teachers. We also loved seeing the pupils learning at home dressed up in their costumes or pyjamas too when we were on our Google class meet.



Y3 had a wonderful day, and would like to say a huge thank you to all of the children at home for joining in with our activities with such enthusiasm.

The children created potato characters, listened to famous authors reading extracts from their novels, and wrote poems based on ideas from Michael Rosen. Throughout the day, we wrote a 'pass it on' story across Year 3, each class writing a sentence and then
