


Every class in the school have been given some

The children in Year 1 enjoyed a history lesson on Friday with Florence Nightingale. We learnt all about how Florence nicknamed her sister 'Pop' and Florence had the nickname 'Bookworm' because enjoyed reading.

Florence Nightingale told us all about how dirty the hospitals were and how the toilets had no seats! Florence helped to clean the hospitals and she became a great nurse. The children really enjoyed the session and enjoyed joining in with some actions.





In year 6, the children have been investigating how nutrients are transported in the body. To do this, the children used potatoes and saltwater which replicated the process of osmosis in the body. The children discovered how

nutrients are water and transferred from the digestive system into the circulatory system

through the process of osmosis travelling through the blood vessels to different parts of the body. When the blood vessels reach these parts, nutrients and water are transferred through osmosis to be used.
