Parents / carers will need to leave a voicemail or text on the number 07949 852541 with the following information:

- · Child's name / DOB / class / Post Code
- · When symptoms started, or the date of the test if asymptomatic
- The test date
- · When the child was last in school

This number will only be monitored between 12 noon - 2pm until Wednesday 7th April. All other positive cases of pupils in school will need to be reported via email to stphilips primary@warrington.gov.uk

Children should not return to school until after 10 days isolation has been completed.
