





# Year 3: Fruits and Vegetables

❑ We often add "s" at the end of the word in Spanish to make the noun a plural word.  
E.g. una manzana / dos manzanas

❑ Grapes are grown in Spain. As you drive along the roads you can see rows and rows of vines with grapes growing on them.
