


Subject Specific Vocabulary		Rhythm grid	Important knowledge about Latin music
sing	To use your voice to make a melody.		<input type="checkbox"/> I know the names of some instruments I can hear as I listen to recorded music, such as an electric guitar, drums and bass guitar.
riff	A short repeated pattern or tune.		
copy back	To sing or play back a rhythm or melody.		
perform	To play an instrument or sing a piece of music.		
rock	A type of music with drums and electric guitar.		
drums	A musical instrument you can hit, shake or scrape.	<div>Graphic notation</div> 	<input type="checkbox"/> I can clap a pulse, increasing and decreasing the tempo.
electric guitar	A guitar which is heard through a speaker.		
keyboard	An electric piano which can change its sounds.		
middle 8	The section of a song which has a different melody and lyrics.		
bass guitar	A low sounding guitar which supports the tune.		
beat	A steady pulse which you can feel in your hands and feet.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can play along on a glockenspiel using C and D whilst keeping to a steady pulse.
			<input type="checkbox"/> I can play back my improvisation and change rhythms or melodies that I don't like.
