<b>lunes</b>	Monday	<b>enero</b>	<b>febrero</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❑ When you ask a question in Spanish you can turn a sentence into a question by raising the pitch of your voice at the end of the question.</li> <li>❑ Some of the Spanish days of the week are named after the planets e.g. martes (Mars)".</li> <li>❑ In Spanish, days of the week and months of the year don't have capital letters at the beginning.</li> <li>❑ When words are the same in two languages we call them cognates and when they look very similar we call them semi-cognates.</li> <li>❑ The months in Spanish are similar to the months in English, except for January (enero).</li> </ul>
