## Important knowledge about Robot Town and Commands

- Verbs in Spanish have different endings depending on who you are talking to.
  For example:
  Everyone look = mirad
  One person look = mira
- When speaking and writing in Spanish, you need to include the 'la' or 'el', which means 'the'. Even though in English we would say 'school' not 'the school'.
- Most Spanish shops shut for an hour or two in the afternoons because people have a siesta – a short nap. Children come home from school too!
- I can listen to and say action commands using correct pronunciation.
- I can write action commands in a sentence.
- I can read places in a town, including using masculine and feminine nouns.
- I can give the simple direction "here" to describe where a place is in Spanish
- ❖ I can ask "where is...?" in Spanish.
- I can read and understand simple sentences around and about a town.
