



# Year 6: Rounders

Subject Specific Vocabulary		Important Information	Important Knowledge
<b>basket catch</b>	The technique for catching a ball that is falling from a height, hands cupped and close to chest.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can accurately throw a ball under and overarm.
<b>stump out</b>	Make contact between the ball and the base before a batter reaches the base.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can catch a ball that has been thrown to me over and underarm
<b>first base</b>	The first point of safety for a runner, no points are scored here.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can catch a ball that is falling from a height.
<b>second base</b>	The first place that you can score points in rounders.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can strike a moving ball with my hand.
<b>deep fielder</b>	A fielding position not placed on a base.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can strike a moving ball with a tennis racket or rounders bat.
<b>batting order</b>	The order in which the batters take their place.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can alter my technique to hit a target.
<b>innings</b>	The turn the batters have at batting and scoring points.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can plan where to throw a ball to have the best chance of stumping an opponent out.
<b>run out</b>	When a batter overtakes a teammate on the pitch.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can retrieve a rolling ball.
<b>obstruction</b>	When a field stands in the way of a batter who is running on the pitch.		<input type="checkbox"/> I know and understand the rules of rounders.
<b>rounder</b>	The points that can be scored in a game of rounders.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can strike a rounders ball and run on to a base in attempt to score a point.
