


frame	A single image in an animation.		
frames per second	The number of frames played per second.		
stop motion	The camera is repeatedly stopped and started to animate objects.		
pause	To temporarily stop the animation.		
onion skinning	The shadow image of the previous frame is present to help you line up the objects.
