landscape	The representation of natural scenery.		
collage	Creating a piece of artwork by gluing a range of materials (e.g. paper, card) to a surface.		
background	The ground or parts of the scenery that are often at the back, furthest away from the viewer.		
foreground	The area closest to the viewer. This is usually the lowest section of your picture and contains the brightest colours and the most detail.		
horizon	A line that runs from left-to-right across the page, where the land meets the sea.
