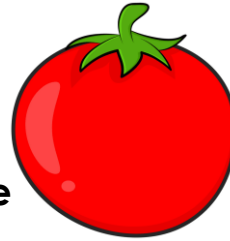

## Important knowledge about Fruits and Vegetables

❑ We often add "s" at the end of the word in Spanish to make the noun a plural word. E.g. una manzana / dos manzanas

❑ Grapes are grown in Spain. As you drive along the roads you can see rows and rows of vines with grapes growing on them.

- ❖ I can orally say different fruits and vegetable nouns.
- ❖ I know how to recognise which nouns are feminine and masculine.
- ❖ I know how use a noun's ending to determine whether it is a masculine or feminine word.
- ❖ I know how to recall numbers between 1 and 15.
- ❖ I know how to use my knowledge of numbers to read different quantities of fruit and vegetables.
- ❖ I know the order that Spanish words have to go in to make grammatical sense.
