


<b>Pentecost</b>	The Christian festival celebrating when the disciples received the Holy Spirit from Heaven.			
<b>conversion</b>	The act of changing from one religion to another.			
<b>Acts</b>	The book of the New Testament after the Gospel, explaining how Christianity was started and spread by the Apostles.			
<b>Corinthians</b>	One of Paul's letters to the people of Corinth to give them instructions and advice on being good Christians.			
<b>Epistles</b>	The letters written by the Apostles to different nations about Christianity.	<b>Key People</b>		
<b>Apostles</b>	What the disciples were called after they had received the Holy Spirit and started to spread Christianity.			
<b>persecution</b>	Treating someone badly because of their beliefs or who they are.	Paul the Apostle 		
<b>missionary</b>	A person who goes (usually) abroad to convert people to Christianity.			
<b>Holy Spirit</b>	The third part of the Trinity: God is active everywhere.
