




# Year 6: Creation and Science Knowledge Mat

A small 'Bibleinfo' logo is in the top right.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I can outline the importance of Creation on the timeline of the 'big story' of the Bible.</li> <li>I can identify what type of text some Christians say Genesis 1 and Psalm 8 are, and their purpose.</li> <li>I can suggest what Genesis 1 and Psalm 8 might mean, and compare my ideas with ways in which Christians interpret it, showing awareness of different interpretations.</li> <li>I can make clear connections between Genesis 1, Psalm 8 and Christian belief about God as Creator as well as humans' role in creation.</li> <li>Show understanding of why many Christians find science and faith go together.</li> <li>Weigh up how far the Genesis 1 creation narrative is in conflict, or is complementary, with a scientific account.</li> <li>There is much debate and some controversy around the relationship between the accounts of creation in Genesis and contemporary scientific accounts.</li> <li>These debates and controversies relate to the purpose and interpretation of the texts. For example, does reading Genesis as a poetic account conflict with scientific accounts?</li> <li>There are many scientists throughout history and now who are Christians.</li> <li>The discoveries of science make Christians wonder even more about the power and majesty of the Creator.</li> </ul>

<p><b>contradicting</b></p> <p>Things that do not go together.</p>		
<p><b>complementary</b></p> <p>Things that go well together.</p>		
<p><b>purpose</b></p> <p>The reason behind doing something.</p>		
<p><b>interpret</b></p> <p>To understand something as having a particular meaning.</p>		
<p><b>Psalm</b></p> <p>A sacred song/prayer from the book of Psalms, often used in Christian or Jewish worship.</p>
