<b>discrimination</b>	Unfair treatment of someone or a group of people based on a particular trait.		
<b>law</b>	Rules that a society or government have developed to deal with crime, business and social relationships.		
<b>treaty</b>	An agreement.		
<b>United Nations</b>	An organisation set up in 1945 to maintain international peace, cooperation, security and develop friendly relations among nations. The UN also attempts to improve social conditions, economic development, public health and human rights.		
<b>contrast</b>	The state of being very different from something else.		
<b>legislation</b>	A law or set of laws.		
<b>freedom</b>	The power or right to act, speak or think as someone wants.		
<b>government</b>	The group of people with the authority to control and make decisions for the country or state.
