




# Year 3: Ancient Egypt

<b>tomb</b>	A large vault, for burying the dead.		
<b>Egyptian pyramid</b>	An ancient structure, mostly built as tombs.		
<b>hieroglyphs</b>	A picture of an object representing a word, syllable or sound, as found in Ancient Egypt.		
<b>scarab</b>	An insect – dung beetle of the eastern Mediterranean area, regarded as sacred in Ancient Egypt.		
<b>scribe</b>	A person who copies out documents.		
<b>sarcophagus</b>	A stone coffin associated with the ancient civilisations of Egypt, Rome and Greece.		
<b>mummy</b>	A body of a human being or animal that has been preserved and wrapped in bandages.		
<b>papyrus</b>	A material prepared in Ancient Egypt from the pithy stem of a water plant.		
<b>achievement</b>	A thing that has been done with effort, skill or courage.
