Music

To secure an outstanding quality of music education.

Success Criteria

Music Curriculum

- 1.1 Curriculum plans are ambitious; they are of high quality, clearly sequenced, building on skills from previous learning, and reflect the Model Music Curriculum.
- 1.2 Curriculum plans give a wide range of composition opportunities, including the use of composing with technology and with written notation.
- 1.3 Themes cover a broad range of genres around the world
- 1.4 Children have the opportunities to perform, both on instruments and singing, in weekly music lessons.
- 1.5 Children in Year 4 have the opportunity to access whole-class guitar tuition.
- 1.6 Curriculum plans are supplemented and supported through high quality, evidence based resources.

Co-curricular Music

- 1.7 A wide range of small group of instrument lessons take place.
- 1.8 A number of ensembles and clubs run on a weekly basis.
- 1.9 School choir, which is open to all KS2 children, rehearse on a weekly basis lead by a specialist.
- 1.10 Children who are Pupil Premium or SEND have access to free tuition, bursary places or clubs.

Musical Experiences

- 1.11 All KS2 children have the opportunity to perform to an audience on a weekly basis during worship.
- 1.12 All children who are taught an instrument in school have an opportunity to perform at least once a year.
- 1.13 Performance opportunities are planned in for every child across school at least once per year.
- 1.14 All children to be provided with listening opportunities from a wide range of performers, both in person and online, developing cultural capital.
