


<b>pitch</b>	How high or low the notes are.		<input type="checkbox"/> Generally South African music has a strong dance beat.
<b>copy back</b>	To sing or play back a rhythm or melody.		<input type="checkbox"/> I can describe a piece of music using musical vocabulary.
