<b>Mayan</b>	A large family of languages spoken in central America and Mexico of which the chief members are Maya, Quiché and Tzeital.		
<b>creation</b>	The action or process of bringing something into existence.		
<b>hierarchy</b>	A system in which members of an organisation or society are ranked according to status or authority.		
<b>significance</b>	The meaning to be found in words or events.		
<b>agriculture</b>	The way people grow plants and keep animals for food.		
<b>kingdom</b>	A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen.		
<b>religion</b>	The belief in and worship of a controlling power, especially a personal God or gods.		
<b>ritual</b>	Something people do in a special way, often as part of a tradition or ceremony.
