


<b>greyscale</b>	A range of tones from light to dark.		
<b>graffiti art</b>	Images, text, or illustrations painted onto the walls or the sides of buildings.		
<b>angular</b>	Having sharp corners or edges.		
<b>geometric</b>	Decorated with regular lines and shapes.		
<b>symbolism</b>	Using an object or a word to represent an idea.		
<b>monochrome</b>	One colour.		
<b>intricate</b>	Very detailed or complicated.		
<b>chiaroscuro</b>	The darkening of background around the face and the addition of shadows.		
<b>gradient</b>	The technique of gradually transitioning from one hue to another, or from one shade to another, or one texture to another.
