









<b>pauper</b>	A person who is destitute (very poor), relies on charity, often sent to the workhouse.		
<b>empire</b>	An extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single monarch.		
<b>urbanisation</b>	The movement of populations from rural areas to towns and cities. The process of becoming more urban.		
<b>industrialisation</b>	A process that happens in countries when they start to use machines to do work that was once done by people.		
<b>workhouse</b>	Provided work and shelter for the poverty stricken.		
<b>government</b>	A group of people with the authority to govern a country or state.		
<b>poverty</b>	The state of being extremely poor.		
<b>slum</b>	Unhealthy, unsafe and overcrowded housing.		
<b>education</b>	A process of teaching, training and learning.
